Deanery Synod 2023-2024 – words for consideration for your APCM report

I would say that this year has been marked by a series of significant changes within the deanery.

We welcomed a new Rural Dean in Revd Catherine McBride and a new Assistant Rural Dean in Revd Jane Morris.

As we reported last year, we had three clergy vacancies so we have welcomed Revd Martin Heath to AMICA benefice, Revd Jane Morris was licensed as Vicar at Norton-in-Hales and Woore. Hodnet and Peplow will be joining the United Benefice (paperwork pending with the Church Commissioners) and then recruitment for a priest will start to support Revd Becky Richards and her new curate Revd Christine Alexander who we also welcomed to the deanery this year.

A further change came with the standing down of our long standing Lay Deanery Chair Richard Ancliffe after many years of service. This has left a vacancy and we would ask that you prayerfully consider if you would be able to support the deanery in this way or if you know of anyone else that you think would. The role is crucial in supporting the Rural Dean, Deanery Synod and involves a variety of meetings at deanery and occasionally episcopal level. You don't need to be a member of Deanery Synod though you do need to be on the electoral roll of a church in the deanery

Another change came as our Deanery Youth Mission Enabler Hannah Garside got married becoming Mrs Willson, and decided to stand down from her deanery role taking up a position with Shrewsbury Youth for Christ - we wish her and Peter many congratulations and pray for her in both her new roles! The Deanery has been reviewing the Youth Mission Enabler role and aspirations for it as well as undertaking work auditing what has been happening and how it can be built on. We are very thankful to all the supporters both financially and in prayer who continue to support our desire to serve God and the families, schools and youth in the deanery. It is amazing to see how God is moving in the Deanery, with children and youth, seniors, families and schools and more.
